About Aboriginal Health Division

The Aboriginal Health Division is a newly formed Division of the Sax Institute. The Sax Institute is deeply committed to advancing the health and wellbeing of First Nations peoples and has a proud history of collaborating with the ACCHS sector and other key stakeholders in research, evaluation and policy. The Sax Institute has worked in partnership with Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Services (ACCHSs) in NSW for more than a decade conducting a program of research that aligns with ACCHS priorities. Our work involves ACCHSs and government partners, as well as multidisciplinary teams of researchers. The program has evolved an integrated approach to using data to generate health improvements and has already resulted in increased knowledge about health and its determinants in Aboriginal children and young people and strengthened services and new programs to improve Aboriginal health through the Study of Environment on Aboriginal Resilience and Child Health (SEARCH). More recently, the program has expanded to focus on other areas of Aboriginal health research including healthy ageing, patient care, food security, evaluation of Aboriginal-led programs and social and emotional wellbeing of their staff throughout the COVID 19 pandemic.

Purpose of position

The Senior Research Associate will be part of the Aboriginal Health Division to assist in the development of a future strategy for the Aboriginal Health Division at the Sax Institute, contributing ideas and innovative approaches. The Associate will play a key role in co-ordinating the collection and analysis of quantitative data for the projects on patient care and healthy ageing. The role will help manage the development of grant applications and ethics applications, provide operational support to testing the approach to research implementation and develop communication resources on research findings for use by ACCHS and policy partners.

The position requires: strong research skills; a strong understanding of ethical research and methodological options; excellent communication skills; personal initiative, flexibility, an innovative perspective; and the capacity to work with a wide range of people including leading researchers and ACCHS partners.

Note that this position requires occasional travel.

- Demonstrated ability to contribute ideas and innovations, develop and implement initiatives
- Demonstrated experience with writing research protocols, reports, findings briefs, ethics applications and/or academic manuscripts and grant applications
- Excellent interpersonal skills and proven ability to work as part of a team, and build successful working relationships with a variety of people and to deliver on commitments
